Continue Learning over the Holiday Break

There are many opportunities to keep your child(ren) learning while they are out on the holiday break. Here are a few:

- * For younger children, here are many holiday books that can be shared together. Whether you celebrate Hanukkah, Kwanzaa or Christmas, there are dozens of stories related to these holidays. Your local library is a great resource for these kind of books.
- * Enlist your child's help in the kitchen. Look over recipes in cook books or online. Have your child read the recipes, then decide together which recipes to try. You can also use the recipe to practice math facts and fractions.
- * Do you receive holiday cards from friends and family? If so, have your child read these cards out loud to you and the rest of your family.
- * Have a Family game night. There are lots of games that will help your children practice all the subjects that they are learning in school. Card games and other games with dice can help younger students count. Trivia games (like Trivial Pursuit or Cranium) can help all students with social studies, history, science, reading and math.
- * Did your child(ren) get a gift or gifts over the break? They can practice their writing by writing thank you cards or even thank you emails.
- * Host a family debate. You can pose simple questions (such as, what is the best holiday?) and ask each family member to state their opinion and give reasons to support their opinion.

Building a Tradition of Literacy

The holidays are a great time to build new traditions. With the days getting shorter, the air becoming more crisp, so you begin looking for some amazing activities to do as a family; consider building a tradition of literacy. In a study by Scholastic, 85% of children find the time spent being read a story "special". Not only can reading aloud to your kid build beautiful memories, it can also improve their standardized test scores. According to Pew Research Center "half of 9-year-old students who scored at or above the 75th percentile on the 2020 reading component of the National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP) reported reading for fun on their own time almost every day, compared with 39% of 9-year-old students who scored below the 25th percentile." On those chilly rainy Saturday mornings, or on those hectic snow days, or simply the night before Christmas; pick a book with your child, cozy up with a sugar cookie, and start a tradition of reading.

Although we want our students to use their English speaking, listening, reading, and writing skills; we also want them to continue using their native language. Please continue to speak to your children in their first language, and encourage them to use this language as well. Having conversations in any language improves your English Learner's vocabulary. Growing your child's vocabulary will improve reading and writing skills. We want our students to be Bilingual Superheroes, so help them use those native language skills and English skills at home!

Reading is the single greatest way for any student to make academic progress in school. Your child's reading abilities also affect his or her performance in other subjects, from math to science! Both reading to your child and encouraging your child to read can improve your child's reading skills. If you are able to read to your child in your Native language, this is actually very beneficial for English Learners. The public libraries have books in multiple languages. The epic books website also has books in English, Spanish, French, and Chinese. Another site, ellstudents.com, offers a list of free books in a variety of languages.
