AT HOME

- Visit teacher-provided websites, such as iPass with my child, to enhance math comprehension.
- Read nightly with my child on an appropriate reading level at least 30 minutes and discuss the reading in order to increase comprehension.
- Practice basic math fact fluency nightly with your child (flash cards, timed tests, etc.)
- Read Envision Math newsletter to be informed about what my child is learning, in Math, and in the classroom.
